Administrative Board Minutes 3.19.2024

Ryan Twigg called the meeting to order at 7pm. Devotional based on Galatians 5:16-26 was shared and followed by prayer.

Secretary Report: February Report was reviewed. Announced Kara Ransbottom will be filling the Secretary position.

Treasurer's Report: Trisha Bentz supplied a Summary Report of February's Revenues & Expenses, including beginning/ending balances. ChurchTrac generated reports were also supplied. Discussions included limitations of ChurchTrac reporting & functionality. Currently a separate spreadsheet is created to be able to see financials in a clearer format. Many goals were discussed including: Assessing future of ChurchTrac software, Position roles/responsibilities, clear processes & procedures, expense management including approval process, resuming budget meetings and balancing the budget. Misty Bolenbaugh -motion to approve report. Randy Linn - seconded. Passed.

Committee Reports: Reports were shared via early submission. Additional updates included: <u>Audio:</u> Mike Pedroza – One mic is not working, trying to fix.

<u>Building Team:</u> John Butler – Good presentation was made on Sunday to update congregation. Plans moving along including estimated ground breaking this spring. No official dates. Building Plans are being submitted to State for approval.

<u>Finance:</u> Neil Field – Finance Committee will be meeting monthly. Next meeting, April 16, @ 6pm before the Admin Board Meeting.

<u>Trustees:</u> Randy Linn – Saturday is Church Cleaning Day 9am-noon. A member inquired about food in the sanctuary, Randy will take concern to Trustees next meeting.

<u>Focus in Ministry:</u> Pastor Bill Halter – Current focus is Holy Week, once concluded will be planning May-July. Considering having *Meat with Pastor* quarterly or as needed.

Old Business: none

New Business: Ryan Twigg introduced a sample *Church Ministry Evaluation Checklist* for discussion. He explained that one of the responsibilities of the Admin Team is to envision & evaluate church ministries. Each month, a few ministries will be evaluated. This includes current & future ministries. The focus this month will be: *HSP*, *Together at Christmas*, and the *Online Ministries*. The goal is to make sure we are being intentional with our ministries, both present & future. Developing a Media Ministry was suggested as a future ministry focus.

Pastor Bill closed with prayer.



The Faith We Sing

The dictionary defines the word miracle in three ways, as an extraordinary event manifesting divine intervention in human affairs, an extremely outstanding or unusual event, thing, or accomplishment, or a divinely natural phenomenon experienced humanly as the fulfillment of spiritual law.

John W. Peterson had experienced a few miracles. He had been a pilot during WW II and had survived the dangers of military duty. But he knew about a different kind of miracle.

While he was a student at Moody Bible Institute, missionaries often came to the school and told of their experiences and how God had changed their lives. To Peterson this was the greatest miracle of all—the miracle of God transforming a sinner into a new creation in Jesus Christ.

One day after hearing a missionary talk about how God miraculously changed his life after accepting Christ, Peterson could not get it out of his mind. Peterson has written more than a thousand songs and thirty-five cantatas. You might think this as miraculous in itself, but that day listening to the missionary, another song took shape in his mind. As soon as it was possible, Peterson rushed to a music room in the building and completed the melody.

2 Corinthians 5:17 -"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" 1 Peter 2:9-10 - "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy."

The hymn Peterson wrote that day was IT TOOK A MIRACLE. We are celebrating Easter season and the experience of Jesus dying on the cross for our sins and then his resurrection was a marvelous miracle, and it was done so that we may have a miraculous life now and in an afterlife with Him.

Peterson died in 2006 and had a major influence on Christian music in the 1950s through the 1970s. *"My Father is omnipotent, and that you can't deny; a God of might and miracles – 'tis written in the sky.*

V 2 Tho' here His glory has been shown, we still can't fully see, the wonders of His might, His throne, 'twill take eternity.

V 3 The Bible tells us of His pow'r and wisdom all way thru, and ev'ry little bird and flow'r are testimonies too. CHORUS – It took a miracle to put the stars in place, it took a miracle to hang the world in space; but when He saved my soul, cleansed and made me whole, it took a miracle of love and

FOOTNOTE: Where did the word "Easter" come from? The origin is unclear. It may have derived from the name of the Anglo-Saxon Spring season dawn goddess Eostre, or, it may have derived from words meaning "rising," "dawn," or "east."







Adage From Ann

Yes, it is spring! At what other time of the year do you find daffodils blooming surrounded by snow? I have heard numerous people worrying over their spring flower bulbs: The weather was warm early; what if we get freezing temps? My hyacinths are in bud. The bulbs will be fine. After all, where do they spend the cold winter? In the frozen ground.

There was one year that I remember: It was unseasonably warm in February, and a single digit cold snap hit. We had railroad ties around our landscape then. The daffodils were about 5" high as I recall. The cold snap hit; what would happen to the flowers. The foliage in, maybe half of the daffodils was severely damaged. The leaves were bent and lying across the railroad ties—and so were the earliest daffodils. Yet, they bloomed! They didn't know that they were handicapped. They turned their faces up to God, shining, as they honored Him.

It is a lesson I remember each spring in Daffodil Season. It seems to be an appropriate topic today for me, at least. I am so tired of moving like a moderate speed turtle. (I have improved from slow turtle speed.) But I still have to get into the far right lane when I push my walker, or I hold up traffic. However, since about the only places I go are to therapy, and to get my hair done, there is not a whole lot of traffic to delay. Those daffodils lying on their beds and blooming, speak to me of those dear ones who are bed-ridden-and vet, still bloom. And we don't need someone else to see us blooming. All we need is our Heavenly Father with us, to see our glow for Him.

We read in Matthew 6:29. 30, 33 "See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? So do not worry saying 'What shall we eat?' or "What shall we drink?' or "What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." And to me, that seems to be the answer to most of what life hands to us: We (I) need to seek a closer walk with God. And how do we do that? Well, that seems to be a whole new topic for another time.

Thank you all so much for your support, prayers, and cards. They are treasured. It is so wonderful to know you are not forgotten, and I will soon be back in church.
